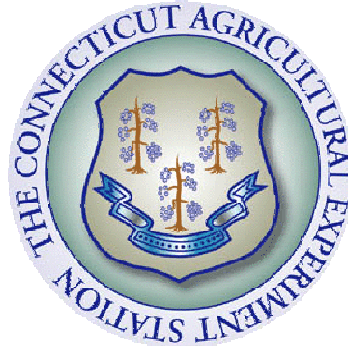

Traveling I-84 Westbound: Take Exit 38 for US-6 W (toward Bristol). Travel 8.7 miles, then turn right onto Rt. 69-N. Travel 3.7 miles to Sessions Woods WMA on the left.

Conservation Arboriculture: State-of-the-art Technologies in Tree Preservation

This workshop offers arborists, tree wardens, and other tree care professionals, as well as any others interested in the preservation of large-stature and old trees, the opportunity to gain important new knowledge about the aesthetic and ecological values of these trees, and the advanced methods available for assessing their health and potential for longevity. Mr. van Wassenauer will discuss the cutting-edge technologies now available to non-invasively evaluate trees for their potential risk. Contrasting older methodologies such as increment coring and Resistograph drilling with new technologies such as sonic tomography and engineering-based wind load analysis (“tree pulling”), he will show that it is now possible to assess internal composition, breaking strength and uprooting safety with minimal invasiveness. The afternoon portion of the workshop will consist of a hands-on demonstration of sonic tomography, assessing the internal condition of a mature tree on site.
